Alice Kennedy 1802- 1888

Little information has been learned about this individual.

Alice C. Kennedy was born in 1802 in Nova Scotia. She married John Clifford. He died in December 23 1881 although even this is not certain. She died in East Mountain, Colchester on 6 Jul 1888.

John Clifford was hired by Hiram Hide to run the Ten-Mile Road House (ten miles from Truro). When the road was shifted further north to avoid two very steep hills John Clifford shifted the operation to the other end of his property. The first location was taken up by the McNut family including Sarah Jane the local Mid-wife.

Alice Kennedy was Roman Catholic in religion but unlike many other Catholics of the time she read the Bible every day, certainly not a usual custom for a catholic of the time. The census of 1871 lists their son James as a Baptist, Timothy as a Methodist and daughter Elizabeth as a Presbyterian.
