Context

The earliest Roddick identified to date is James Roddick who was born on 30 June 1776 in Dalton Dumfriesshire Scotland. He married Janet Armstrong daughter of William Armstrong and Agnes McCormack Freeman (?) on 30 January 1804 in Annan Dumfriesshire Scotland. She was born in 1779 in Dumfriesshire Scotland and died on 15 April 1816 in Annan, Dumfriesshire Scotland.

James Roddick, son of James Roddick and Grizzel Beatie, was born 25 Jun 1776 at Dalton, Dumfriesshire, Scotland. He was baptised 30 June 1776. He married Janet Armstrong 30 January 1804.

James and Janet had the following children:

3. i. Margaret Annison Roddick b. 21 September 1804 in Annan Dumfriesshire, m. David Campbell in 1825 in Dumfries, Scotland, d. 24 Mar 1861 at Eaglesfield, Middlebie, Dumfries-shire, Scotland
- ii. Grizzle Roddick born in Cummertrees, Dumfries-shire Scotland on 10 February 1806
- iii. James Roddick was born about 1811 in Annadale, Dumfries -shire Scotland. Hr died on 19 May 1896 on Wattletree Road, Malvern, Victoria, Australia.
- iv. Mary Roddick born in Scotland 1816. She died on 18 March 1879
- v. Janet Roddick born 11 Nov 1816 She died on 18 March 1879.

3. Margaret Annison Roddick 1804 – 1873 David Campbell 1791- 1873

Margaret Annison Roddick, son of James Roddick and Janet Armstrong, was born on 21 September 1804 in Annan Dumfriesshire. She married David Campbell, son of James Campbell and Janet Harkness in 1825 in Dumfries, Scotland. He was born in Hutton and Corrie, Dumfriesshire Scotland and died in Middlebie, Dumfries-sire on 18 November 1873. She died 24 Mar 1861 at Eaglesfield, Middlebie, Dumfries-shire, Scotland. They had four children,

- i. James Campbell b. 11 Jan 1826 at Annan, Dumfries-shire, Scotland, m. Janet Broatch 28 May 1845 at Graitney, Dumfries, d. 23 Nov 1875 Kirkandrews-on-Esk, Cumberland, England
- ii. William Campbell
- iii. Janet Campbell
4. iv. Grace Campbell b. 12 Aug 1831Annan, Dumfriesshire, Scotland, m. 01 Jun 1855 Daniel McNab at Middlebie, Dumfries-shire, Scotland, d. 23 Apr 1923 Neepawa, Manitoba, Canada.

Haplogroup Group H11a2a1

The author's matrimonial line traces back to Grace Campbell. On February 29 2016, the maternal haplogroup for the author James Retson was identified as H11a2a1.
